Garrett County Community Action Head Start/Early Head Start is a federally funded child development program designed to provide high quality early childhood experiences to prepare children for success in Kindergarten, and to prepare families to be active participants in their child's education. Early Head Start and Early Head Start Child Care Partnership serves children birth to age three, as well as pregnant women. Head Start serves children ages 3 to 5 who are not eligible for Kindergarten.

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Head Start Approach to School Readiness

The Head Start Approach to School Readiness means that children are ready for school, families are ready to support their children's learning, and schools are ready for children. Children are assessed in the domains of Approaches to Learning; Social and Emotional Development; Language and Literacy; Cognition; and Perceptual, Motor and Physical Development. In program year 2020-2021 assessments of ongoing learning was interrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic as Garrett County Public Schools were unable to administer the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA). Head Start however was able to administer the Work Sampling System assessment to enrolled Head Start children with 60% of 4 year olds measuring Fully Ready and 62% of 3 year olds measuring Fully Ready in the spring of 2021. Early Head Start children were assessed using the OUNCE Scale from ages 4 months to 42 months with 88-100% Developing as Expected based on the parameters of the assessment for 8 age milestones.

Parent Engagement

Garrett County Community Action believes in engaging families in order to achieve overall family well-being and understands that children perform at a higher level when they are part of a thriving family. As a part of GCCAC's Dual Generational approach, which consists of working with children and parents, families receive financial education and coaching; career coaching and assistance; and bundling of services as necessary.

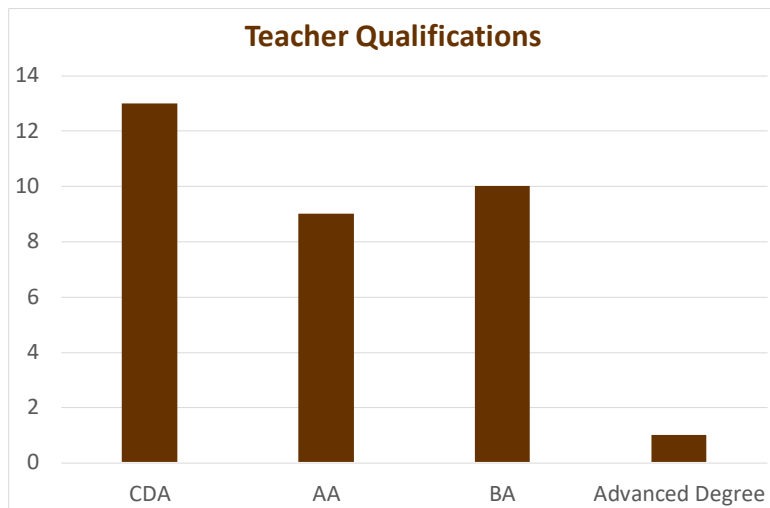
Parent meetings/trainings are held on a monthly basis. Training opportunities for parents include budgeting and financial education as well as career readiness and child and family health and nutrition. GCCAC also links families to partner resources within the community that promote overall family well-being. Parents participate in monthly Policy Council meetings to assist in program decision making as well as serve as volunteers in the classroom.

Health and Dental Services

- 100% of children and prenatal women enrolled in HS/EHS/EHS CCP programs 30 days or longer had health insurance.
- 90% of children enrolled in HS/EHS/EHS CCP programs are up-to-date on a schedule of age-appropriate preventive and primary health care according to Maryland's EPSDT schedule for well child care.
- 79% of children received dental preventive care and/or completed an oral health examination while in Head Start.

Head Start Review

From April 13, 2020 to April 17, 2020, the Administration for Children and Families conducted a Focus Area One (FA1) monitoring review of the Garrett County Community Action Committee, Inc. Head Start and Early Head Start programs. On June 11th the program received a Program Performance Summary Report with no Areas of Concern, Areas of Noncompliance and/or Deficiencies. The report was reviewed with program staff, Policy Council and the Board of Directors.



Financial Audit

A financial audit of Garrett County Community Action Committee, Inc. for year end September 30, 2019 by Turnbull, Hoover & Kahl P.A. dated December 4, 2020 reported 2 issues related to Head Start programming including a material weakness of the timeliness of audit information and a significant deficiency related to authorization of payments in which two signatures weren't obtained prior to invoice payments.
